* The IQAC guides and monitors the faculty and students on quality assurance and enhancement. With the guidance of the faculty members, our students balanced their co-curricular and extra-curricular achievements with their academic pursuits. Our students excelled in sports and brought laurels to the college with their sports achievements. Silver Medal was awarded to our student in Junior World Championship 2021 (62 Kg Women's Wrestling) held at UFA, Russia from August 16-22, 2021 with many other medals at national and state level. The students were invigorated to participate in various competitions organised by other institutions where they won various prizes.

* IQAC maintained the standards of the college in its holistic development. The college was awarded the 3rd Prize in Swachh Sarvekshan 2021 by Municipal Corporation, Karnal on December 04, 2020; bestowed with the award of Best NCC Institution 2020-21 by No. 2 Haryana Air Sqn. NCC, Karnal in the ATC-134 held at Sainik School Kunjpura on February 08-12, 2021 and conferred with NSS Award of Recognition 2019-20 (delayed due to covid 19 pandemic) by NSS Cell, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra on NSS Day, September 24, 2021.

* Under Quality augmentation initiatives, National Level Webinars/Conferences/ Workshops, International Level Quiz Contests were organised during the session. The faculty members were stimulated to enhance their knowledge by participating in Short Term Course/Capacity Building Programmes, FDP's, Paper Presentation/participation in International & National Seminars/Conferences/Webinars, etc. Extension Lectures, Workshops, Programmes/Campaigns, Extension Activities, celebrations of various days and numerous competitions were organised for students. IQAC also contributed in organizing a National Level Webinar on "Intellectual Property Rights: Introduction, Benefits and Importance of IPR", journey from learning to earning, on February 10, 2021 by dint of Google Meet. Ms. Pooja Menon, Chief of Operations IPFIDE was invited as keynote speaker and Mr. Mukesh Mishra, Co-founder IPFIDE as co speaker. 150 participants witnessed the webinar.

* IQAC convened an Online Parent-Teacher Meet, on July 10, 2021 via Google Meet. The agenda of the meet was to communicate with the parents and brief them on the academic performance of their ward. On the whole, 349 parents of students belonging to all the three streams; Arts (84), Science (115) and Commerce (150) of Undergraduate and Postgraduate classes participated in the meet. The institution and its working received an affirmative feedback from the parents' end, also they appreciated the efforts made by the institution to provide quality education at such crucial time of pandemic.

* With the initiatives of IQAC, Sahayog Club was formed under Social Outreach Program in the month of September 2021. With the vision of raising a sense of responsibility among students towards their active positive role in uplifting society, this club strives to mould the young minds of students and instill in them level headedness towards the society at large. Providing an environment and culture that nurture a feeling of brotherhood, gratitude, respect, and love for their family, friends, and society, the students are exposed to activities and outreach programs that develop them into empathetic, compassionate and good human beings. Sahyog Club aims to address the socio-economic problems of marginalized group of society and make them aware about digitalization, innovative ways to conserve environment, spread awareness amongst them on psychological issues like women's mental health, educating people on sanitization, how to adhere to Covid-19 protocol, etc. 40 dedicated students are the members of this group at present with 06 faculty members.

7) Head of the institute also interacts with faculty members and students to know about their problems regarding syllabi, usage of smart technologies for curriculum delivery and so on.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The college works proactively to assess the learning levels of the students and organizes special classes for advanced learners and slow learners as per their needs. Before the commencement of classes, the different requirements of the students are identified and addressed at the earliest by way of a strategic approach. Bright and diligent students are motivated and inspired to bag university ranks. They are also encouraged to take the competitive exams like GATE, GRE, TOEFL, NET, UPSC etc. Semester toppers and university rank holders are dually felicitated. Care is taken by the faculty in monitoring the performance of slow learners. The students' performance is accessed continuously through tests, assignments, projects, presentations, workshops, and group discussions. The internal evaluation process includes:

1. Two Handwritten Assignments (Ist Assignment after one month & IInd Assignment after two months) - 10%
2. One Class Test/Sessional - 5%
3. Attendance - 5%.

The Examination Committee floats the schedule of the class test. Assignments, class tests/sessionals are discussed during the class after evaluation by respective teachers. It aims to provide sufficient transparency and accountability. The students' performance is displayed on the notice board and communicated to

the students. The teachers pay particular attention to non-performing students. In labs, students are assessed based on their day to day performance while implementing experiments, including regularity and their aptitude.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

College has adequate facilities for teaching like 46 classrooms, 37 laboratories and 4 seminar halls. It is divided into academic blocks viz. Kalpana block including Chemistry, Botany, Geography, Zoology, Biotechnology and Physics departments; Hansraj block having Home Science, Commerce and Mathematic departments and Dayanand Arts block. Hostel facility is provided to students from distant areas.

Departments are equipped with projectors, visualizers, computer equipment like desktops, laptops, printers, photocopy machines, Wi-Fi connections, etc. 'Central laboratory' has assets like PCR, BOD Incubator, Fluorescent and Inverted microscope, Laminar air flow chambers, Computer attached UV Illuminator, Double beam spectrophotometer, etc. 'Zoology' lab has a museum with approximately 200 specimens. 'GIS Laboratory of Geography Department' has 10 licensed ArcGIS software. 'Home Science department' possesses labs like 'Food and Nutrition', 'Food Science and Quality Control', 'Fashion Designing', 'Fashion Technology' & 'Garment Construction' and 'Cosmetology' labs. 'Physics lab' has equipments like, Radio Frequency Oscillator, Helium Neon Laser, Cathode Ray Oscilloscope, etc. 'Botany lab' has Compound and Dissection microscopes, Binoculars, Specimens, etc. 'Chemistry lab' has Spectrophotometers, Water Deioniser, Polarimeter and Digital Melting Point Apparatus.

College has 'Commerce Office Management' and 'Functional English' labs also. Vocal and Instrumental rooms possess instruments like

Sitar, Tabla, Harmonium, Santoor, Banjo and Tanpura.

Solid waste management:-The waste generated in the campus includes wrappers, paper, glass, tin, and organic waste / processed food waste that gathers from usage at canteen and hostel. This waste is collected by the personnel of Karnal Municipal Corporation in dustbins marked separately for wet waste and dry waste. Leaf litter is decomposed in a compost pit to be used as manure for the gardens in the college.

Liquid waste management:-The liquid waste generated in the campus includes sewage, laboratory, hostel and canteen waste. All waste water lines are connected with main municipal drainage. Laboratory waste water doesn't contain any hazardous chemicals and monitoring is done by maintenance team.

E-waste management:- Electronic goods are put to optimum use. The minor repairs are set right by the laboratory assistant & teaching staff and major repairs are handled by technicians and are reused. The waste compact discs and other disposable non-hazardous items are used by students for decoration during college fests. The equipment which cannot be reused is stored appropriately for annual disposal under the supervision of senior faculty from Department of Computers.
