11. Significant contributions made by IQAC during the current year (maximum five bullets)

- 1. The IQAC guides and monitors the faculty and students on quality assurance and enhancement. With the guidance of the faculty members, our students balanced their co-curricular and extra-curricular achievements with their academic pursuits. They excelled in sports and brought laurels to the college with their sports achievements, winning a Gold Medal in 2022 Dan Kolov and Nikola Petrov Wrestling Tournament held at Bulgaria, February 17-20, 2022 and a Silver Medal in Junior World Championship 2021 (62 Kg Women's Wrestling) held at UFA, Russia from August 16-22, 2021 with many medals at national, state and inter-college level. The students were also inspired to participate in various competitions organised by other institutions where they won various prizes. They were also encouraged to participate in different competitions organised by other institutions for enhancing their knowledge and boosting their confidence.
- 2. IQAC maintained the standards of the college in its holistic development. The college was awarded the 3rd Prize in Swachh Sarvekshan 2022 by Municipal Corporation, Karnal in January 2022; bestowed with 'NSS Award of Recognition 2019-20' (delayed due to Covid 19) on September 24, 2021 and 'NSS Award of Recognition 2021-22' by NSS Cell, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra on NSS Day, September 24, 2022. The Principal was acknowledged by numerous organizations for the initiation of conducting various events in the college. ('Certificate of Appreciation' for active contribution in successful organization of 'Antarrashtriya Geeta Mahotsav 2021' by the District Administration, Karnal from December 12-14, 2021, 'Certificate of Appreciation' on December 23, 2021 by 'Prayas Society', Kurukshetra, for actively promoting and participating in Drug De-addiction Campaign, felicitated by 'National Social Organization' for organising 'Blood Donation Camp' organised by NSS Cell, KVA DAV College for Women, Karnal in collaboration with National Social Organization, Karnal on May 02, 2022, 'Paryavaran Prahari Samman' by 'Yes We Can - Helping Hands of God', an NGO, for admirable support in Tree Plantation on July 12, 2022).
- 3. IQAC convened an Online Parent-Teacher Meet on June 7-8, 2022 via Google Meet with the vision to interact with the parents and inform them about the academic performance of their ward. The parents gave positive feedback of the college and it's working in the present time and appreciated the efforts made by the institution to provide quality education to the students. Regular Mentor-mentee Meetings were organised with the students throughout the session in online and offline mode under the guidance of the IQAC.

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- 4. International/National Advisory Committee comprising of renowned and eminent academicians was formed for the organization of various academic events and activities in the college.
- 5. To augment creativity and knowledge quotient amongst students and faculty, various curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities were organised to complement the overall academic credentials of faculty members and the holistic development of the students. Dr. Anju Narwal & Ms. Shivangi participated in the five-day Workshop on "Implementation of New Education Policy (NEP) 2020 organised by Institute of Integrated and Honors Studies, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra from June 13-17, 2022. Dr. Manju Singh, Convener, IQAC and Ms. Meenu Sharma, Co-convener participated in the State level Workshop on National Assessment and Accreditation Process of NAAC organised by Department of Higher Education, Haryana and Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra on September 06, 2022 held at KUK. 15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The college offers various courses in Arts, Science & Commerce stream at UG and PG level. Since the college is affiliated to Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra, Haryana, it follows the guidelines and instructions given by the affiliating university. The institution is well prepared and welcomes the holistic multidisciplinary approach of NEP 2020 and will follow the plans and procedures implemented by the university. Credit System would be adopted as per the guidelines and instructions of the affiliating university. The college has formed multiple clubs and societies to NSS, NCC (Army & Air Wing), Sahyog Club, Women Development Cell, ICCASH, Eco Club, Arya Yuvti Parishad, etc. that promotes community engagements and service, environmental education and value-based towards attainment of a holistic and multidisciplinary education. The members of these societies/clubs are the students from various streams of the college.

The institute offers multidisciplinary flexible curriculum in B. Voc. (Fashion Technology) & B. Voc. (Food Science and Quality Control), where multiple exits are offered - 1st Year: Diploma, 2nd Year: Advance Diploma and 3rd Year: Degree. In other courses, the institute follows the guidelines as prescribed by the affiliating university.

A survey may be conducted to access the demands of the students around. Some new short-term and vocational courses may be initiated. The institute also plans to offer multidisciplinary certificate courses/workshops. A women primer institution, the college stimulates the students for self-employment and entrepreneurship, promoting women empowerment.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

ABC has not yet been adopted by the college. It will be adopted as per the guidelines and directions from the Kurukshetra University, the affiliating university. New courses may be introduced under

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credits through the affiliating university. The college also motivates the students to opt for courses under SWAYAM, etc.

17.Skill development:

The college offers B. Voc. in Fashion Technology and B. Voc. in Food Science & Quality Control in which additional certificates are offered by Sector Skill Council after special examination.

Various add-on-courses like Functional English, Fashion Designing, Beauty Culture and Cosmetology, Food Processing and Preservation, Web Designing, Multimedia, Animation and GIS and Remote Sensing, Diploma in Health Care (Community College) are offered by the college to develop the skills of the students and help them for self-employment and entrepreneurship skills.

The college promotes value-based education to inculcate positivity amongst the students by performing yajnas/havans, motivational lectures, workshops, and celebration of various national and international days, etc. The students are guided for making projects for Science Exhibitions at national, state, district level.

Furthermore, after the directions for implementation of NEP 2020 by the affiliating university, the college will adopt new courses.

18. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The college offers the courses made accessible by the affiliating university. After implementation of NEP 2020 by the university, the college will adopt courses as per the directions of the affiliating university.

Short Term Courses on Indian Languages may be offered.

The students of B. Com/BBA, B. Sc FD obtain the basic knowledge and skills for pursuing business or self-employment/ entrepreneurship. The focus is to develop the skills of the students and develop a scientific temper and pragmatic approach amongst students.

20.Distance education/online education:

The provision of learning through Distance Education is offered only by the university. However, if permissible at any stage, the college will offer the same as directions by the affiliating university.

During Covid 19 pandemic, the college adapted to the new normal and switched on to the virtual mode of teaching and learning through various platforms viz. Google Classroom, Zoom, Google Meet, etc.

The college also aims to create awareness among students regarding the various courses running through distance education at IGNOU, etc.

1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation			

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

The college has a well-defined planning and implementation process for the effective delivery of the curriculum. The college is affiliated to Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra, hence it is obligatory to follow the 'scheme and curriculum' prescribed by the university for different courses. - 1)To review the progress for completion of syllabus as per the aforethought lesson plans regular meetings of HODs with their respective teachers are held.
- 2) It is mandatory for the pupils to complete and submit assignments periodically.
- 3) According to University norms, one mid-semester exam (sessional) is conducted for each subject per semester.
- 4) Internal Assessment comprises of marks attained in assignments (two per subject, per semester), mid-semester exam and attendance.
- 5) Seminars (through power point presentation), surprise tests, quizzes, group discussions, models/charts etc. are the regular features of class-room teaching. ICT based teaching and learning is implemented.
- 6) Regular interaction with students by their respective teacher incharges helps in resolving doubts and seeking feedback for improving and making the existing academic mechanism better.
- 7) Head of the institute regularly interacts with all HODs to get an overview of the departmental progress on syllabi completion, students' difficulties, measures to be adopted to improve existing academic environment, etc.
- 8) Head of the institute also interacts with faculty members and students to get their feedback related to their problems regarding syllabi, usage of smart technologies for curriculum delivery and so on.

Before the commencement of classes, the different requirements of the students are identified and addressed at the earliest by way of a strategic approach. Bright and diligent students are motivated and inspired to bag university ranks. They are also encouraged to take the competitive exams like GATE, GRE, TOEFL, NET, UPSC etc. Semester toppers and university rank holders are dually felicitated. Care is taken by the faculty in monitoring the performance of slow learners. Departments conduct remedial classes and provide course notes to thestudents, especially the slow learners. Such students have to give regular class tests in order to improve their performance. Most of our students hail from the rural and semi-urban belt. Our college is alive to this social reality and accords priority to mainstreaming the slow learners. There is a provision of student mentoring to address the concerns of slow learners through counselling, social facilitation and academic advice, wherever required.

College has been divided into different academic blocks viz. Kalpana block, including Chemistry, Botany, Geography, Zoology, Biotechnology and Physics departments; Hansraj block, having Home Science, Commerce and Mathematics departments and Dayanand Arts block having adequate classrooms, laboratories and seminar halls. Hostel facility is provided to students from distant areas. Departments are equipped with projectors, visualizers, computer equipment like desktops, laptops, printers, photocopy machines, Wi-Fi connections etc. 'Central laboratory' has assets like PCR, BOD Incubator, Fluorescent and Inverted microscope, Laminar air flow chambers, Computer attached UV Illuminator, Double beam spectrophotometer, etc. Zoology lab has a museum with approximately 200 specimens. 'GIS Laboratory of Geography Department' has 10 licensed ArcGIS software. 'Home Science department' possesses labs like 'Food and Nutrition', 'Food Science and Quality Control', 'Fashion Designing', 'Fashion Technology' & 'Garment Construction' 'Cosmetology' Labs. 'Physics lab' has equipments like, Radio Frequency Oscillator, Helium Neon Laser, Cathode Ray Oscilloscope, etc. 'Botany lab' is has Compound and Dissection microscopes, Binoculars, Specimens, etc. 'Chemistry lab' has Spectrophotometers, Water Deioniser, Polarimeter and Digital Melting Point Apparatus. College has 'Commerce Office Management' and 'Functional English' labs also. Vocal and Instrumental music rooms possess Sitar, Tabla, Harmonium, Santoor, Banjo, Tanpura, etc.

Waste generated owing to campus activities is managed judiciously after appropriate segregation as degradable and non degradable. A dedicated team monitors this task and maintains proper record of the

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waste management processes.

Solid waste is managed by collecting it in separate bins marked for Wet Waste and Dry Waste. These bins are placed at strategic points on the campus. The solid waste thus collected is further transferred to the waste collection dumpers plied by the Karnal Municipal Corporation.

Leaf litter is assembled in compost pit and used as manure after appropriate decomposition. This organic manure is used to upkeep the greenery on the campus.

The liquid waste generated in science labs, hostel, canteen etc is directed to municipal drainage system via underground pipelines. These pipelines are repaired regularly to stop pilferage. Monitoring is done to ensure that waste from laboratories does not contain any hazardous chemical.

The e-waste generated by all departments is collected by the Department of Computers. It is disposed off annually under supervision of senior faculty from Department of Computers.

The principle of Reduce, Recycle, Reuse is followed to minimize waste generation and use resources optimally.
